demanding the suspension of the four policemen who shot Joyce. However, Mayor Beverly Briley announced that patrolmen George Wall, Jimmy McWright, William Stroud Jr., and Jimmy Nash, all white, would not be suspended from the force because he had found no violations among them from what has been presented to him.

Blacks are still angry over two other incidents that happened not long ago: first, the police killing of a Black youth named Huddleston, whom they claimed was stealing newspaper stands, and the knife-planting incident after the killing of Cedric Overton in the J. C. Napier Projects.

Blacks also say that the Black police on duty at the time of the Joyce killing were sent to East Nashville. And the four white policemen involved had never been seen in North Nashville before the incident.

A spokesman for Nashville's Independent Police Union charged that the resignation of Chief Mott resulted from pressure exerted by certain groups who are anti-police.

One officer said that Mott "felt dejected, let down." And added, "He was trying to do a good job. He must have said to hell with it. It seemed like he was fighting a losing battle."

AT A NEWS conference, Mayor Briley said, "Regardless of the people who try to create a violent atmosphere, this community — Black and white — is united in support of law and order."

The mayor became angry in a series of exchanges with a reporter concerning police guidelines. Briley started the exchange by saying that the police officers had responded "in the manner that they have been trained to do."

A reporter then asked whether police "are trained, when somebody is running away, to shoot—to shoot to kill, to shoot in the back."

"They're trained in accordance with the law," the mayor retorted angrily, then asked repeatedly: "Who are you? Who are you? Who are you?"

Asked about F.B.I. policy governing the use of firearms, a senior F.B.I. official in Nashville gave this explanation of F.B.I. "rules and regulations."

"We do not shoot a fleeing felon nor fire warning shots," the official said. "If a man is fleeing, you have to give chase. We try to avoid this problem by having enough manpower to dominate the scene."
